- Cyanosis, PaCO2 normal
- Hypotension,
- Hypoxia (PaO2<8kPa, SpO2 <92%)
- Exhaustion
- Silent chest
- Threatening PEF < 33% best or predicted (in

those >5yrs old)



OMEPRAZOLE

Generic name: Omeprazole

[oh-MEP-ra-zol] Brand name:

PriLOSEC, PriLOSEC OTC, Zegerid Drug class : Proton pump inhibitors

What is Omeprazole?

Omeprazole is used to treat excess stomach acid in conditions such as non-cancerous stomach ulcers, gastroesophageal reflux disease (GERD), active duodenal ulcer and erosive esophagitis. Omeprazole works by blocking gastric acid production and is from the group of medicines called proton pump inhibitors.

Omeprazole side effects

Severe stomach pain, diarrhea that is watery or bloody.

Warnings

Omeprazole can cause kidney problems. Tell your doctor if you are urinating less than usual, or if you have blood in your urine.

Minor Bleeding:

- Wash the area with soap and water.
- Apply dressing to the wound.
- Once the bleeding has stopped, apply antibiotic ointment and an adhesive bandage.

Major Bleeding:

- Apply dressings to the wound and put direct pressure on the dressings.
- If bleeding continues add more dressings and press harder.
- If there is a life threatening bleeding from an arm or leg, use a manufactured tourniquet. Place it 2 to 3 inches above the injury. Tighten it and note what time you put it on.
- If the severe bleeding is on a body part that is not the arm or leg, pack the wound by placing a material like clean gauze or clothing tightly into the wound.
- Call Emergency number, if,
 - $\checkmark \quad \text{There is a lot of bleeding}$
 - \checkmark You cannot stop the bleeding
 - ✓ You see signs of shock
 - ✓ The injury is from a fall, and you suspect a head, neck, or spine injury
 - \checkmark You are not sure what to do
